We began our search for a German Shorthaired Pointer online. We live in Tennessee, so of course we started our search for a dog in the surrounding area. We did not have any luck finding what we were looking for in a dog. We expanded our search to Wisconsin since we were both born and raised there. Our search retrieved several different breeders all with good reviews and credentials. We knew we were looking in the right place due to the amount of field trials and the number of associations in the state.
